## Frequently Asked Questions

### 1. What is AskRt?

AskRt is a web based communication tool that allows members of SIRF Rt's Roundtables to pose a question to the broad membership so that people may contact other people with a similar interest.

### 2. When was it developed?

AskRt was first put on line in May 2003. It is a beta version. This means that it has not been tested on all possible configurations of equipment, software and operating systems. It works well in our testing environment but there may be the odd glitch. We would appreciate it very much if you could provide feedback to us on any problems you have with it or any suggestions for improvements. Please email [peter.mckinna@sirfrt.com.au](mailto:peter.mckinna@sirfrt.com.au) with your comments.

### 3. Is it a bulletin board?

It is similar but different. Bulletin boards tend to show the discussion on the bulletin board for all participants to see. AskRt allows users to pose a question anonymously. Only those who are interested in discussion on the question respond to the question. Discussion is "offline" between people who have an interest in the particular issue.

### 4. How do I participate and how do I cancel participation?

The first step is to send an email to [askrt@sirfrt.com.au](mailto:askrt@sirfrt.com.au) with the word "subscribe" (without quotes) in the subject line. This automatically makes you a member and you will then receive broadcast emails from the AskRt network. You can unsubscribe from AskRt by simply sending an email with the word "unsubscribe" in the subject line.
